Previous Event Reports

Christmas Car Trial: 8th December 2013



9 cars assembled at the Croydon Lodge for the annual 2013 Aussie Muscle Christmas car trial and prize giving on Dec 8th. First up this year was throwing an empty Gulf Oil drum to a peg on the golf course. Some interesting techniques were used here with Tracy Tyler throwing it nearly into a nearby tree that was 10m away from the peg!
